This November you have a voice in Provo's future. This \$69 million bond will help Provo replace essential facilities it has outgrown and worn out. After years of studying options, the City Council UNANIMOUSLY supports this effort.

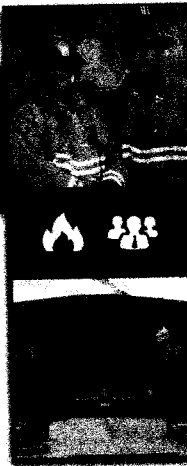

6.5% of the bond will replace **Fire Station 2** on Canyon Road. This facility was built as a single family home and converted to a fire station. Provo has outgrown the space.



53% of the bond will build a new **police & fire headquarters** with a **911 dispatch center**. The remaining 40.5% will go towards building a new **City Hall**, with offices for our various departments.



### ...WHY NOW?

### The Engineer's report states:

#1

**The current facilities are not seismically safe.** Cracks are already appearing in the foundations, it would cost more to fix than rebuild.



#3

**Building costs are increasing.** It is the fiscally conservative option to fix it now instead of putting it off again.



#2

**Systems are failing.** The electrical, mechanical, and roofing systems are on the verge of complete failure.
