Fact #1: Color Days

A flyer about First Grade Wasatch Color Days was sent home on Friday with your child. We will be talking about the primary colors first. Red today, yellow tomorrow, and blue on Wednesday. The secondary colors will be talked about next. Green on Thursday and Purple on Friday. Orange will be the following Monday, August 28. We will also be having a small snack associated with each color each day and making a color book similar to the book, "Brown Bear, Brown Bear" each day.

Fact #2: Binders

Thank you so much for your generosity in bringing school supplies to the classroom. The only thing that your child needs ASAP is the three ring binder. We write in our journals every day and children who do not have a binder have had to just put their papers in their desks. Thank you for all of your willingness to help in the classroom this year. We are still in need of one more parent room representative for each class as well as a Fall Festival Representative for each class.
