Some parents have asked about Friday and where to mark that your child has read his or her book. This is a "bonus" book and helps your child to make up for a day that he or she may have missed earlier in the week. YOU CAN ALWAYS MAKE UP A MISSED HOMEWORK DAY or NIGHT. It can be read on Friday, Saturday or Sunday. Many books are not being signed each night. Your child cannot get a new book unless the home reading book from the night before has been signed by an adult. A big thank you to those of you who have been doing this each night.

Fact #6: Homework Initials

Please make sure and INITIAL your child's nightly homework. I need to see what activity was done and that an adult was listening to your child read in order for your child to get credit for completing the work. You only have to put your initials on one of the three boxes. Thank you!

Fact #7: Phonics and Sight Word Testing

Last week we talked about short I words. This week we will be talking about l-blends to help children look at bigger words than just CVC words. Each week the children are introduced to four new vocabulary words that they must pass off to mastery. So far this year they have had the words what, does, not, school, up, down, out and very. This week's words are be, come, good and pull. Please help your child review these each week.
