Goals & Incentives (review from Family Guide)

The last week of each month, we have "Check-ins." Teachers/Aides meet with individual students to see where they are with the following goals. If they are having trouble, we do additional practice at school, and ask for help at home to meet their goals. <u>All successes are celebrated</u>. <u>Students are encouraged to go at the pace that's right for them</u>.

The ABC Club is an incentive for students to fluently name all letter names and sounds. (Fluency is within 3 seconds per letter.) Students will earn a special book, a cheer, and certificate when the goal is met!

The 100 Club is an incentive for students to count to 100. Students will earn a 100 Grand bar and certificate, and a cheer.

The Cookie Club is an incentive for students to keep up with the high frequency word goals. Each month the Kindergarten Korner newsletter publishes the words we will be working on for that month. (Fluency is within 3 seconds per word).

Each student begins with a special "cookie jar" to keep at school all year. Each month the student increases the number of words read from the previous month, a felt cookie is added to the jar. At the end of their kindergarten year, they will take home their full cookie jar as a memory of what they've worked hard to achieve this year. This is a fun incentive for students to learn their high frequency words, and for teachers and parents to help their students succeed!
