Special request coming... © Please, if your child will be gone for a family trip, let their teacher know as soon as possible. In the month of December, there is a required state testing window, and students will each be assessed one-on-one. If we teachers know in advance when you'll be gone, we can try to work around your schedule.

Midvear Assessments

In December, we'll be conducting statewide reading assessments during the school day. These are important and helpful in guiding our instruction as teachers and supporting your students!

Because fluency is important for comprehension, there will be timed checks of the following~

- # Reading letter names, capital and lower case
- # Reading word chunks (short "nonsense words" that make up longer words, ex. cac, tus)
- # Listening to a word and then verbally telling the first SOUND they hear
- # Listening to a word and then verbally telling ALL the sounds they hear (finger stretching)

How can I help my student be successful in the assessment?

- I. Please avoid scheduling dentist or other appointments during this window.
- 2. Please help your student get a good night's sleep each night.
- 3. Please be especially consistent with homework during this month.
- 4. IF YOU CAN, try to fill parent volunteer slots IF they are offered by your teacher.
- 5. Please be sure your student has eaten a good breakfast.

We keep the assessments game like, and students at this age typically enjoy the opportunity to show off what they've learned! \odot

For students who can already identify these letter names and sounds, their focus will be reading words with these letters, generating their own words with these letters, and writing these letters correctly on the dotted lines.

Math

- I can solve addition and subtraction equations, paying attention to the plus and minus signs (up to 5).
- I can find different ways to make the number 10. (Ex. 9 + 1 = 10, 8 + 2 = 10, etc.)
- I can put numbers in order 0-10.
- I can find the missing number in a sequence of numbers.
- I can notice and talk about the patterns in a 100 Chart.
- I can count to 100. (Class goal: Everyone can count to 100 by February!)
